Image PersistenceDo you notice a ghost image on your LCD screen?

Are you afraid that you have burn an image into the your screen like happened on the old CRT display?

You are in luck with your LCD screen. It is not image burn-in rather it is "Image Persistence"

To quote Apple,

With some Apple LCD displays, if you leave an unchanging image (like a login screen or the same desktop picture) on the screen for a long period of time, you may see a faint remnant of the image even after a new image has replaced it. This is called "persistence".





Meeting was called to order at 7:05pm with one guest and five Board members present at the Camp home and was adjourned at 8:34.

Reports were accepted. Balance in all accounts is \$1448. The Red Chip was drawn at September 14 meeting, paying \$66, so the value begins October at \$5.

Do You Have Several Macs On A Wireless Network? Is your Network running at the lowest common denominator?
