NorthWest Apple Pickers Board Meeting, November 18, 2008

The Board Meeting was called to order at 7:00 and adjourned at 8:37 p.m. at the Camp home. Six members and one guest were present.

The reports showed that the balance in all accounts is \$1417 and that the Red Chip begins December valued at \$18. Attendance at the New User Group was 14 including one new member and two visitors and 8 at the Novice SIG. There were 19 members at the General Meeting. Publicity was distributed to 16 outlets and newsletters/flyers posted at four places in addition to the libraries. The first iWeb meeting was held October 29th at the Summit library.

In December there will be no Novice SIG; the New User Group and General Meeting will be at the Lakewood Library, the Mortvedt session will meet December 12th, and the iWeb SIG will meet on the 17th. The Annual Swap Meet and Holiday Potluck Party is scheduled for Sunday December 14th and a committee was appointed to handle the details of selecting gift items for the drawing. In addition, the Bring One to Get One gift exchange will be held. General Meeting in January will feature a presentation by Erick Camp about Audacity, February's topic will be You Tube, and the Annual Elections will be held in March.

Bylaws were finalized by the Board at a special meeting on November 4th and copies will be inserted in the members' December newsletters for review before the formal vote at the January 11th General Meeting.

The Sign-in/Greeting duties have been assigned to board members Brynestad and Putman and Beels will be the monitor of the Red Chip Drawing with support from President Camp in transporting supplies to the meetings.

Webb Olliphant, Member at Large, resigned from the Board last month. The Board appointed Marilynn M. Russell to fill the position for the balance of the term.

The Board decided how to handle the obsolete paper records from past meeting sign in sheets, etc., and directed the Membership chair to dispose of such items appropriately if the necessary information has been entered into the club's electronic records and properly backed up. A decision about creating an Archive was tabled until additional information could be gathered.

The Board authorized President Camp to upgrade the service for our web hosting from 150 MB to 10 GB plan through our current provider, DaFirm.



Got a MagicJack for internet telephone service. Here is what I have to say after 5 days of use. I went out and bought a new telephone with two additional remote wireless handsets. The MagicJack plugs into a USB port on my PC and the telephone plugs into the other end of the MagicJack which is about the size of a fat thumb drive. If the MagicJack is a little too wide to fit in a USB port without interfering with other USB devices a short extension cable is provided. There is a learning curve and I haven?t gotten up to full speed yet. I certainly am not yet to the point of dumping my QWest land line for internet only phone service. While experimenting with the new service I found that the MagicJack does work wirelessly while plugged into my MacBook at the far end of the house. One last complaint: The only telephone number available for New Mexico is area code 505 which is for Albuquerque and Santa Fe. In southern NM we use 575. Not all area codes are (yet) available. For instance no code for New Hampshire can be assigned. Not wanting to have to explain why I have an Albuquerque number I changed my initial 502 number (first change is free) to a 207 number, Maine. My friends know I live in Maine in the summer. A disappointment: MagicJack will not work with my pre-Intel Mac Mini. I'd be more comfortable leaving the Mini on 24-7 for phone service than having to leave the power hungry PC on all or most of the time. More on MagicJack next month.

Was printing pictures with my Epson PhotoMate when I got a message: "Change InkPack soon." Kept going and did not turn the unit off. In standby it uses very little power. A few days later (printer still on) "Change InkPack very soon." Kept going and since the first warning I'd printed perhaps 35-40 4x6 prints. The only problem that showed up [now] was a purple band along the left edge of some of the photos. Got 15-20 more photos to print. I have a little slicer thing that I used to trim about 1/32 of an inch from the photo and that eliminated the purple. The moral of the story: Keep going as long as you can. Unlike some color 4x6 printers the whole photo doesn't get off color (low ink supply) with the

Epson PhotoMate and ink can be "stretched" a long way.

My old D-Link wireless base station was acting odd so I sprang for a new Apple Airport Extreme unit. Setup was easy but the install didn't work out. Good thing there is a reset button so I could start over. Then (the next day) I noticed that the power light was blinking amber, not steady green. Darn, I had to read the manual. Repair did not go well and the reset switch came into use 3-4 more times. Finally got it fixed to my satisfaction and set to transmit on 5 GHz 802.11N only. Nice steady green light and an Apple product I can recommend.

Great feature of Airport Extreme is being able to connect a USB drive and share that drive between two or more computers. So much better than the two NAS drives I bought which were big failures. Now I'm using a small pocket sized Lacie drive that gets all its power via its USB connection to the Airport Extreme. I had to jump through a hoop or two to get it to work with my PC. The instruction book almost told me how to do it and I figured out the rest on my own. My next challenge was to be able to share the drive wirelessly with my MacBook at the other end of the house. That took experimentation but after a while worked flawlessly. I was surprised as to how fast a transfer of all my Excel files went from MacBook to the remote USB drive. My ZyXEL "sniffer" has the signal show up as 802.11A on channel 36.

Hope you got your free (not a trial version) of Crossover Pro 7.1.0 when it was offered for one day only a few months ago. I was able to replace my older version. The WEB site says this:

"CodeWeavers" mission is to make Linux and Mac OS X fully Windows compatible operating systems. We do this through the power of Wine, which powers all of our CrossOver products. The CrossOver products make it possible to run Windows programs on Mac OS X and Linux without needing a copy or license for Windows itself.? I wonder if Bill has been wondering if CodeWeavers could somehow be sued?


