
Installing iLife 11

From Tid Bits:

Our friend Liz Castro reports that when the new iPhoto '11 (which hasn't arrived here yet) attempted to upgrade her iPhoto Library, it failed in such a way as to delete 230 GB of photos. Others are seeing the problem too, so you should either avoid installing iPhoto '11 until there's a fix from Apple or make sure you have multiple backups before installing. It's also probably best not to interrupt the upgrade process, no matter what.

From our very own Stewart Beels:

Here is some advice from Stewart Beels about installing that copy of iLife 11 which can avoid some issues. First: use Disk Utility to Repair your hard drive. Second: use Disk Utility to Repair Permissions. Third: now back up your iPhoto library. Fourth: NOW install iLife 11. Fifth: Repair Permissions again. Sixth: run Software Update to install the latest iLife update. Note: iLife 11 requires an Intel Mac running 10.6.3 or above.



TOM'S MAC NOTES DEC. 2010

Are you tight with the lucre? Want to save more of it? Get out to those weekend yard sales. Where I live (in the summer) in Maine we get a list of the Saturday yard sales in the Friday newspaper. Some recent finds: Canon LiDE 30 scanner. The lady said, "I think it works." Translation - She had no idea. Asking price \$3. Offer price \$2 and it was mine. Comment to my wife - "If it doesn't work I'm only out two bucks. It's worth a try." Took it home and it worked fine. I'm very familiar with that scanner model because it is exactly like the scanner I use in New Mexico. Nicest thing about it is that it requires no external power supply getting all the power it needs vis the USB cable. Next great buy:

Actually a free item. Saw a Dell 16 inch CRT monitor with a "FREE" tag. I asked the lady if it worked and she said, "It works OK. My son gave me a flat panel monitor so I don't need it anymore." Took it home and it is a fine addition to the computer room hooked up to my laptop as is an external keyboard.

Getting a Windows laptop to work with the lid closed so an external keyboard and monitor can be used is a snap. Go to Control Panel and there is a place to select what to do when the lid is closed. "Sleep" is the usual answer but "Do Nothing" is another selection and the one wanted for external keyboard and monitor setup. Not so easy with a MacBook. But, there is a way. Maybe several ways but the one I'm using is a program called "insomniax." Find out about it at:

Cool voice commands for iPhone 3GS and iPhone 4: Hold down the Command button for slightly less than 2 seconds and bring up Voice Control. Say something like "What time is it?" or "Dial" for phone use or various music play commands.

Interesting iPhone feature accidentally discovered: While talking on iPhone and the screen blanks out to screen saver mode but I need to see the keypad to enter

a tone instead of having to touch somewhere on the glass just give the phone a shake and the motion detector will pop up the display.

TotalFinder is only at Ver. 1.0.1 but it is a handy way to organize finder windows in a better way than "ordinary" finder windows. I have it set up to pop up a finder window via Control-V and now all folders are organized at the top of the list, not spread around alphabetically.

Another nice Mac app is Switche. This one gives a different (better?) view of open programs when Command-Tab is hit. An even better view when you use Option-Tab.

One thing I never liked about iPhoto was its method of storing photos in one big proprietary file that is hard to work with. Forget about using it in finder. Problem solved with a program called iPhoto Library Manager.

Well, not quite solved. As of right now (early November) the software is not able to work with the new file format used by the recent release of iPhoto 11, version 9.

The program looked like it had a lot of promise. I got the impression that I could look at/edit photos independently of the iPhoto program. The way iPhoto consolidates photos into one mysterious large file with no manipulation possible outside of the Apple program has often irked me.* So, I downloaded and installed the Library Manager to check it out. Not having previously used it I didn't know what to expect. Expectations didn't pan out because I was trying to use it with iPhoto '11. Online comments told me that the program has not been upgraded to iPhoto '11 capability. The author sent me an e-mail (after an inquiry) saying:

"The current version of iPhoto Library Manager (3.5.8) will work OK with iPhoto '11 for basic things like creating libraries and switching between your existing

libraries, but the more advanced features such as copying albums and merging libraries will require an update to iPLM to provide full compatibility. I've already started working on the update (which will be free), and I hope to have it ready to go in the next week or two. I'll be sending out an e-mail announcement when the update is available - if you'd like to be added to the e-mail list, just let me know."

Two weeks later and still no upgrade. The program won't do anything worthwhile if you have iPhoto '11.

Related item: Be sure and have a backup (to external media) of your iPhoto library before installing iPhoto '11 as it is possible that the install will wipe out your library and most of your photos. A common thumb drive won't work unless it has more than 4 gigs of free capacity. And, older photo libraries will need to be converted to the latest iPhoto format.

Windows tip: Thunderbird 3.1 was installed as an update and that was the end of my ability to send email. I got a copy of an older version, 3.0, and was back in business but I wasted a lot of time trying to fix version 3.1. Keep this type repair in mind for Mac programs that misbehave.

* Editor's Note: iPhoto can edit photos in an external editor such as "Adobe PhotoShop Elements"
