Apple announced it early in 2010, the tablet has defined a new market. As it nears its second birthday, we will be spending some time each month exploring the features that have made it such a desirable product.

The iPhone, of course, is approaching its fifth birthday. The latest models feature the Siri application which begins to seem a lot like something from the bridge of the Starship Enterprize. Its touch screen interface has transformed the way folks deal with smart phones and tablets. Now many of the features of the Mac's Lion system include gesture controls that trace their origin to the iPhone.

While the iPod was introduced nearly a decade ago, its various models have all contributed to the evolution of simple touch controls on elegant, efficient devices. Ten years of customers adjusting their expectations, getting used to new ways of accessing and storing their music and photos has been possible by the creation of iTunes.

Step by step, device by device, Apple has been as busy in this decade transforming the way we do business as they were in their first and second decades. When the main product was Mac, keeping up with newly released operating systems was fairly simple. They arrived at predictable intervals. Each release included evolutionary changes and improvements.

And then along came OS X a decade ago and while we were trying to figure that out, all these other products began to ship.

So here we are about to explore the Mac system 10.7 and the products that use iOS 5. And we need to understand iTunes. And we need to look at the way the App Stores work. And then there is the iCloud service which is going to help keep all these various devices and files and systems "synced" for us.

The longest journey begins with the first step. So once again we begin our tour of the latest and greatest: step by step over the next few months we will explore some, maybe most, of these technological wonders.

December Annual Christmas PartyBy Peter Winderling


