At NorthWest Apple Pickers, 2014 begins our annual tour of the the current systems that run Macs (Mavericks 10.9) and the iDevices (iOS 7.) Both have added some features and improvements to their predecessors. For those of us who have used previous systems, the user interfaces have added a few new wrinkles but are based on the tried and true principles we are familiar with. For someone who got a new iSomthing for Christmas and has never used one before, there are some things to learn.

and having a fantastic time. But at some point, the iTunes gift cards ran out.

We had linked my debit card to his Apple ID, and had explained that he needed to ask permission before every purchase. He said, "Sure Mom! Thanks!"

My son DID follow the rules, at first. And of course we always said yes...what's 99 cents? No big deal, right? But I don't think HE understood exactly what he was doing or what the consequences were after he stopped asking permission.

A week later I logged into my bank account to pay some bills... Imagine my horror to see that there were \$327 in iTunes charges deducted. I was completely speechless. Somehow my husband and I managed to stay relatively calm, because we knew that that our son didn't realize what he had done. He was very upset, and in fact, he eventually paid us back every penny. I was very proud of that!

To keep this disaster from happening again, I now have my son's account set with an allowance limiting his spending. I purchase iTunes "Gifts" to fuel the account, and set a monthly limit.

Here's how you can do it too...

You'll need to set it up using your Computer, and you'll need to have:

- 1. The latest version of iTunes, which is 11.1.3.
- 2. Your Apple ID and a debit/credit card on file.
- 3. If you're buying it as a gift for someone, you'll need the recipient's email address, i.e., the parent of your niece.

Open up iTunes and then go to the iTunes store. On the right hand side of your screen you'll see "Ouick Links".

Click on "Send iTunes Gift". Enter the recipient's information there and choose a dollar amount. You can personalize it by entering a message. Click "Next".

Choose the theme for the gift, i.e., birthday, Christmas, etc. Click on "Next".

And then you confirm the purchase and the recipient gets the email. Easy Peasy!

If there is any dollar amount left at the end of the month, it does carry over to the next month.

I hope you find this information as helpful as I did! On behalf of iPad Pete and his staff, we wish you a Very Merry Christmas to you and your family!

Enable Access For Assistive Devices Function Missing In Mayericks

OK it's not missing. Apple just decided to move it.

The function is missing from the Accessibility preferences in Mavericks.

Thankgoodness for Google. After a bit of searching, we found that Apple had simply moved the option... to the Security Preference Pane. You'll find it in **System Preferences > Security & Privacy > Privacy > Accessibility**. Unlike previous versions of OS X, which used a universal checkbox in an "all or nothing" approach, the new functionality in Mavericks allows users to individually choose which apps can gain control of the system to perform their various scripted functions.
