Annual Dues will be \$40 beginning May 1st 2014

The members voted at the Annual Meeting to raise the annual dues for NorthWest Apple Pickers five dollars to \$40. This increase will take effect beginning on May 1st, which will be the 30 days following this published notice to members.

The increase in dues will allow the club to gradually increase the bank balance so that we are better prepared for hardware or software expenses that we may face in the future. The last time dues were raised was in 2003 when they went from \$30 to \$35.

Save \$5 by paying your dues before May 1st

Example ~ if your dues are due in July pay them before **May 1st 2014** and you only pay \$35 instead of \$40 saving yourself \$5.

Note from your Friendly Editor. If you don't want to save the \$5, send me \$40 prior to April 15 & i will pay your dues and keep the extra \$5 for handling fees.

Our organization survives on volunteerism. The Board meets each month to review expenses and plan programs and services. You may have noticed that we are one volunteer short in the list above: we need a Secretary. Glenda Alley, who has served with distinction as Secretary for the past two years, has “retired” to travel this year. The Secretary reports the minutes of the Board meeting so that we can publish them in this newsletter and keep members informed.

We have been surviving on volunteerism for a while. Our group was first organized in 1984 and Bob Brown was President. The Apple][was the most common computer among members initially, but the Macintosh became more widely used within a few years. In 1994, when I joined the organization, the Apple][folks had formed their own group and NWAP concentrated on Macs. The MacOS 7.1 was just being upgraded to 7.5 when I became member #108. We met at the NW Properties building for several years until they sold the building and we hunted for a new home.

The 1990s were filled with lots of excitement in the personal computing arena. Platform Wars provided lots of flash and smoke as Brand X and Brand Y (and sometimes Brand Z, too) conducted a running battle for the hearts and minds of the vast numbers of folks who were trying to choose their first computer.

User Groups were a way to learn about the new fangled device you had invested (way too much money) in for no good common-sense reason. The Northwest region had the Raincoast Association of groups from Victoria and Vancouver B.C. to Grants Pass OR and Eureka CA which held an annual conference. After a meeting in Portland, attendees from our area got together and proposed Tacoma as a venue: volunteers from NWAP and TAPCUG were joined by Boeing Computing Society, KEGS, and others and proceeded to put on a couple of great conferences. Corporate sponsorship for such conferences began to fizzle and Raincoast Association Conferences ended.

Out of that association, NWAP’s homeless situation was solved when Cyndie Carr from TAPCUG suggested a way our two groups could form an asso-

ciation and share their meeting contract with the Lakewood Senior Center. We lived happily ever after--almost. When Clover Park Technical College expansion took over the facility, the Senior Center moved to its present location at the Lakewood Community Center and the costs for our two monthly meetings became too high for our budget.

We returned to the place NWAP originally met in the 90s: the Lakewood Library (mostly, unless there is a reservation conflict and we need to find another venue from time to time.) In 2004 we began conducting a monthly meeting for Mac users at the Tacoma Lutheran Community’s Mortvedt Center, open to anyone. Folks from NWAP volunteered to provide coaching to those who attend.

We continue to serve folks who are new computer users (even after all these years!) as well as many who are trying to figure out iPhones and iPads. Our group is not filled with rocket scientists nor do we admit that we are computer nerds. We will agree that we like learning and enjoy sharing what we know.

So, 30 years and counting. Our sister organization, TAPCUG is celebrating their anniversary on April 19th and we wish them a Happy Birthday. Like us, they survive on volunteerism. Partisanship and Platform Wars are not as strident as they used to be! PCs and Macs are more alike in many ways these days than they are different. What they are used to accomplish are far more sophisticated and wide ranging than the what we used machines to do a decade or two ago.

User Groups are alive and well. They appeal to a special group of folks who see value in gathering together to learn. To volunteer. To share. To celebrate mind over mere machine!

Annual Meeting Notes

March 9, 2014

2. It was proposed that annual dues be increased from \$35 to \$40. Discussion followed and dealt with some of the reasons for building the financial reserves. The motion was made, seconded, and passed to increase the dues to \$40.

3. A proposal to convert monthly newsletters to digital delivery to members was made. The webmaster noted that a small number of members currently have requested that and than anyone who wishes to do so may log into their NWAP account to make the change (in the event of a family membership, both members must opt to view the newsletter digitally.) An advisory vote to the Board was held: the majority of members present voted in favor of accessing monthly newsletters on line.

This year is the 30th anniversary of the founding of our club and of the Tacoma Area P.C. Users Group, as well. The milestone was noted. Mary and Dave Fleck reported they had joined NWAP in 1985.

The Annual Meeting was adjourned at 3:27p.m.
