That first decade(I), from MCMXXCIV to MCMXCIV, NWAP members included folks who used Apple II models as well as Macintoshes. Personal computers were beginning to show up in schools—and many of our early members were educators anxious to understand these new tools. Desktop computers were also beginning to appear in businesses. Software and printers were beginning to change publishing, photography, word processing, accounting, inventory management, scheduling... well you can fill in the rest. A revolution in the way we dealt with data was underway. As more PCs got into the hands of everyday users, more and more ways to harness their computing power were invented.

During our second decade(II) the Internet reached into the homes (and workplaces) of our members. Macs had evolved from monochromatic to color displays. Competition had grown fierce as personal computers became much more common and being able to use one was becoming an requirement for more and more jobs.

These years included some lean ones for Apple, when less expensive PCs using Windows gained popularity in business and institutional settings. What folks used at work encouraged many to get the same system to use at home. But in MCMXCVII Apple introduced the iMac, a Bondi Blue bubble which signaled a new focus on products for Apple. Our club members were delighted with the change. We continued to get together to learn about new operating systems, new processing chips, and new software.

NWAP's third decade(III) saw the arrival of the iPod, the iPhone, and the iPad. Other new services and devices expanded the scope far beyond the original Apple II and Macs. Apple Stores showcased products in retail settings that amazed us old timers who remember the "bad" old days when Macs were often hidden at the back of stores and customers were ignored or insulted. All during this decade the operating systems have become more stable and powerful, the hardware has become more durable. Connectivity and versatility of the computing world has expanded far beyond anything we could have imagined a few years ago.

Throughout these years NWAP has continued to provide a safe place for folks to learn how to use their Macs...and iOS devices. In these recent times many of us have had to figure out how to connect more than one (or one kind) of device. We are exploring a huge universe of information and at the same time discovering how to protect ourselves from malcontents, malware and mayhem, hoping no Clouds will rain on our parade.

So here we are, XXXI years after that momentous Super Bowl XVIII back in MCMXXCIV. Soon Super Bowl XLIX will be history (Go Hawks!) and members of NorthWest Apple Pickers will proceed through the rest of MMXV exploring iOS VIII and OS X [or, as we say in Arabic numerals, iOS 8 and OS 10.10.]

Some of us in the group have been along for the ride for a couple of decades or more. Whether you are a newbie or and old timer, the value of being a member is being able to learn, to share experiences, and to enjoy the company of interesting people.

For those of us who use Arabic numerals (which Europeans started using about a thousand years ago) that new volume number means that our club has begun year 31 of operation. And we still have not run out of things to learn.
