Phabulous, Phrustrating Photos

We continue to explore the wonders of Photos.app as we deal with the photos we took over the summer. This software arrived with Yosemite and replaced the familiar iPhoto (which still works.) While the editing tools are presented in a new way, Photos can doctor images in much the same way as iPhoto or a number of other similar programs. The biggest issues most of us have had converting to Photos are the changes in the way photos are organized (Events, Albums, Collections, for example.) Some of the data and tags on the old system do not show on the new system.

Our September 13th General Meeting will explore the organization facts we need to know to manage Photos. We'll also discuss some of the editing features and ask members to share their favorite photo image of this summer's picture taking. (Hint: bring the image on a thumb drive!)

"I have never seen a major software company so technically inept and getting worse. Every month there seems to be some new major issue with this software," griped Bill of Scottsdale, Ariz.

Intuit promised that it would continue to maintain and develop Quicken until it finds a buyer, adding that it plans to release the next edition, Quicken 2016 for Windows, and would keep working on the Mac version. Current users should see no interruption in their ability to use the software or its associated services, such as Quicken Bill Pay.

"As we move through this sale, it's business better than usual," wrote Eric Dunn, who heads the Quicken unit, in an online statement. "As a standalone business, we'll focus solely on taking Quicken to the next level. And until we find that buyer, we'll continue to provide you with [the] dedicated, uninterrupted service and support you deserve."

If Intuit keeps to its usual schedule, it will ship Quicken 2016 in the next several weeks. Quicken 2015, for instance, launched in early August 2014, while Quicken 2014 appeared in early October 2013.

Quicken is one of the oldest desktop products, preceding even Windows. Quicken debuted in 1983, near the beginning of the PC revolution, and first ran on Microsoft's DOS.

For anyone who has driven the North Cascades Loop, the list of wildfires is a sobering tally of scenic waypoints along the route. At Newhalem the Seattle City Light tour is an introduction to the hydroelectric dams on the Skagit River. Over Rainy and Washington Passes and on to the eastern slopes of the Cascades, from Mazama, Winthrop, Twisp, Carlton, and Methow the road leads down the valley toward the Okanogan and then southward along the river to Chelan. How many of us have spend the day on Lake Chelan on the tour to the top of the Lake for lunch at Stehekin?

Or have you turned north into the Okanogan and driven through Omak and Tonasket? Have you been through Republic and over Sherman Pass to Kettle Falls and Colville then south through Addy and Deer Park to Spokane? Just to the east is Coeur d'Alene. And to the south is The Palouse, where I grew up.

When I looked at the map of all the wildfires it amazed me to see how they covered so many parts of the state that I had visited in the course of roaming around over many decades. (By car, not horse and buggy, mind you!)

Fires are raging in our neighboring states, as well. The West's drought has left our forests and range lands ready to burn. One of the fires in Idaho is a few miles east of my old home town and very near Laird Park, where groups in our community often held special event picnics in the summer. Along the North Fork of the Palouse River, the park was a great place to gather to share all those wonderful things that picnics meant. Along with the simmering pot of hot dogs we had all those mysterious casseroles, stews, fried chicken, hot dishes, salads, desserts, and freshly-cranked ice cream.

A little further toward the headwaters of the river is the spot my Dad used to sneak off to (to try to lure trout to his cast. He always had the creel and reel in the trunk of the car, just in case the opportunity arose.)

One of the wonders of the computer age is the incredible maps and that is what triggered all these memories for me. Seeing the contours of the land on these maps makes it easier to visualize what the country must be like. When I looked at this fire area, I realized that this might be on the very mountain-

side where our family once spent the day collecting huckleberries (and keeping on eye out for bear.) I recall a hot, dusty afternoon clinging to the stony slope and wondering what was so great about the tart little berries.

The maps that cover the communities and areas hit by this year's fires will, for some time, continue to show things the way they were *before*. As satellite photos capture the newly burned places and update the views, there will be many fewer buildings and great areas waiting for new growth. Let's hope that folks who have lost so much will be able and willing to rebuild soon, so that the maps will soon reflect a healthy, vibrant, verdant *after*.

I look forward to touring this great state and finding that everyone, every community, and every ecosystem has successfully moved past this dreadful season to rebuild, renew, and resume. After all, Washington is the Evergreen State.

Intuit Puts Venerable Quicken Up On The Block

Intuit yesterday announced that it would sell its Quicken unit, the group that creates the personal finance software that made the company famous.

The news -- and Intuit management's explanation for the sale -- illustrated the retreat of personal computer desktop software and the rise in cloudand subscription-based services. It also distressed users, who wondered whether the banking and investment software would survive, and if not, how they would replace a program they've relied on for years, sometimes decades.

On a conference call with Wall Street analysts Thursday, CEO Brad Smith said Intuit would focus on its small business and tax software, represented by <u>QuickBooks</u> and <u>TurboTax</u>, respectively -- both have strong cloud- and subscription-based businesses -- and is ditching <u>Quicken</u> because, as a strictly desktop product, it has neither.

"As you know, Quicken is a desktop-centric business and it doesn't strengthen the small business or tax ecosystems," said Intuit CEO Brad Smith in a conference call with Wall Street Thursday. "Our strategy is focused on building ecosystems and platforms in the cloud. We value our loyal Quicken customers and we're seeking a buyer who will provide the product support and the service they deserve."

Right.

"I expect Quicken to be dead in two years at best," predicted someone identified as "rickbee9," in one of several comments on the Quicken discussion forum thread about the proposed sale.

Others questioned Smith's explanation, saying that Intuit is simply ditching its weakest money makers to make its balance sheet look better. "[It's] clear that Intuit is divesting itself of the lowest revenue items, no matter how they spin it," wrote

"smayer97" on the same thread. "It is clear that this has nothing to do with which segment classes of products they are keeping vs. not ... they are clearly only wanting to keep the top revenue items."

The three units Intuit plans to sell -- Quicken, QuickBase and Demandforce -- accounted for less than 6% of the firm's fiscal 2015 revenue, and just 2% of its net income during the same period. For the last 12 months, Quicken contributed just \$51 million to the company's total revenue of nearly \$4.2 billion.

One indicator of the soon-to-be-sold units' worth in investors' eyes is that not one Wall Street analyst asked a question yesterday about their proposed sale.

In a <u>FAQ</u> about the <u>Quicken sale</u>, Intuit asserted that it would find the right home for the personal finance software. "We are seeking a buyer that recognizes the value of the brand, respects the customers and will invest in upgrading the product and support experience," said Intuit. "We intend to run a crisp process, focused on engaging with strong and reputable buyers."

Customers weren't buying that either.

"I love how [the CEO] is telling you that he can pick a buyer in a way that they will do everything they didn't do," said "QuicknPerlWiz". "Quicken is 32 years old, and to a developer that usually means code that is really hard to maintain, and that certainly shows."

In many ways, Quicken is software that users love to hate. With years of data in the company's proprietary format -- and few alternatives -- they not only feel trapped but also regularly rail about the product. Quicken's listing on

<u>ConsumerAffairs.com</u>, the consumer advocacy organization's website, makes for dismal reading: The overall satisfaction rating is one star out of a possible five.

"I hate this program. I've been using Quicken for many years, and it just get[s] worse and worse with each update. It is less and less user friendly," alleged Beverly of Midland, Tex.
