Where did "REPAIR DISK PERMISSIONS GO"? OR

OS X: El Capitan's Deletion of "Repair Disk Permissions" Could Impact You

Apple's next version of OS X El Capitan uses something called "System Integrity Protection" to prevent the alteration of critical system files. As a result, scripted installers and even privileged admin users can no longer change those UNIX file permissions and then modify them. This should make El Capitan more stable and secure. So, while "Repair Disk Permissions" is gone, that also creates an important issue for users: software upgrades.

The high level explanation for this analysis comes in the public beta [release notes](#) under Notes and Known Issues, Other:

System file permissions are automatically protected, and updated, during Software Updates. The Repair Permissions function is no longer necessary.

How to Create a Folder on the iPad

That is why it is important to know how to create a folder on the iPad.

A folder on the iPad can display sixteen apps on a single page and can hold fifteen pages worth of apps, although having more than a couple of pages full of apps in a single folder may defeat the purpose. And folders are mostly treated just like any other app, which means they can be moved around the screen or even placed on the iPad's home screen dock.

In fact, a great way to organize your iPad is to create several folders to hold your most used apps and then drag those folders to the dock. This gives you easy access to all of those apps without searching through page after page of apps.

The Fastest Ways to Launch an App Without Searching For It

Here's How to Create a Folder:

- 1 In order to create a folder, you will need to identify at least two apps you want to place in the folder.
 - 2 Hold your finger down on the first app until it begins to jiggle. We'll call this the "move state".
 - 3 While the iPad is in the move state, hold your finger down on the app and drag it until the app icon is on top of the other app you want in your folder.
 - 4 When you hold the app icon directly over another app icon for more than a second, the screen will zoom into a new folder. To create the folder, simply drop the app by taking your finger off the screen.
 - 5 You can rename the folder by tapping on the name at the top of the screen. This will bring up the keyboard and allow you to type in what you want for the name. **Keyboard**
- Tips.**
- 6 To create the folder, simply tap outside of the folder's icon area. This is the shaded area beneath the folder's name. Or, you can tap the home button once to leave the "move state" and a second time to return to the home screen.
 - 7 You can add additional apps using the same method: hold down on the app icon to drag

it, hover over the folder and drop it. You don't need to wait for the screen to zoom into the folder. So long as you are holding the app icon directly over the folder, the icon will drop into it.

How To Defeat/Remove Malware

Somehow MacKeeper got on my Mac Mini last summer and I kept getting popups, dropdowns and requests to call in to get help fixing my Mac. So I lived with it for a while but when I had trouble with my iPhoto crashing I decided to call Apple. I called the 1-800-MYAPPLE (1-800-692-7753) and began a wonderful experience with a helpful Apple support technician. After I gave him the info about my system, he assured me that he could fix my malware problem and iPhoto issue. Was I relieved and there would be no charge. Even though I am out of warranty and don't have Apple Care, it was free service.

The tech had me do the "Repair Disc Permissions" in the Utilities--> Disc Utilities of the Applications folder. Then he had me download a program called Malwarebytes. This is a third party software that Apple uses and trusts to clean out malware. The web address is:

After I downloaded it and installed it, he had me run the scan to check for malware and it came up with about a page of malware. Then I deleted that and he had me clear history of each of my browsers and restart and I had like a new computer without popups.

So if you are experiencing malware or unknown stuff going on in your computer, you might want to install Malwarebytes. It is recommended to run this occasionally to check for malware.

Where did “REPAIR DISK PERMISSIONS GO”?

This change will generally go unnoticed by most average users except for the absence of that button in /Applications > Utilities > Disk Utility.app. A revised, better looking and [easier to understand version of Disk Utility](#) comes with El Capitan. However, in some cases, there could be further impact.

System Integrity Protection

This change comes under the umbrella of an OS X El Capitan feature called System Integrity Protection. The overall goal here is to prevent an overly ambitious installer that wants its own way or a piece of malware from altering critical system files and compromising the security or stability of OS X.

Apple has provided a way for developers or expert IT managers to turn SIP off when absolutely necessary, but that's something ordinary users will never learn about nor ever need to do. Developers have access to that information.

As part of the upgrade process, if the El Capitan installer finds unauthorized files in certain protected directories that don't belong there anymore, perhaps from a long forgotten installation, *it will delete them*. This could lead to some of your important software not operating as expected—or at all.

What this means for the average user is to take inventory of all mission critical apps to make sure they can migrate to El Capitan.

Upgrade Thoughts

Because of the above, it's probably a smart idea, in this author's opinion, to do a clean install of El Capitan and then reinstall just the software, updated for El Capitan, that you need. You can check on compatibility at "[Roaring Apps](#)" or by directly querying the developer's website. I surmise that some software in the [Mac App store](#) may need to be modified and may not be able to make the leap.

One question to ask is why Apple didn't do this sooner. The answer is that Apple typically warns developers ahead of time that certain functionality will be deprecated. It gives developers time to react. For example those same release notes state: "*OS X El Capitan is the last major release of OS X that will support the previously deprecated Java 6 runtime and tools provided by Apple.*"

The bottom line here is that Repair Disk Permissions is going away because Apple is hardening OS X against alterations to critical system files via System Integrity Protection. The fallout for the customer is that it'll be more important than ever to certify that every critical app used is ready for the migration to El Capitan.

Election of Officers
