trying to make sense of Watergate and Viet Nam.

The Bicentennial celebrations on July 4th around the country were spectacular. The tall ships in New York Harbor for a brief moment recaptured scene from the past. Fireworks dazzled and galas amazed.

Technology was advancing on many fronts. The last K&E slide rule was produced a week or two before NASA's Viking I lander touched down on Mars and a couple of months before Viking 2 landed.

It was a year filled with other breakthrough, too: the VHS cassette was introduced to compete with Betamax and the IBM introduced the first laser printer.

On the other hand, we still had telephones that were wired to the wall–mobile phones had been demonstrated but the first cell system was years off in the future. Drivers were getting used to unleaded gas, cumbersome emissions equipment and catalytic converters. The OPEC Oil crisis in 1973 had shaken American drivers.

The world in 1976 welcomed Peyton Manning, Brock Huard, and Reese Witherspoon and said farewell to Howard Hughes, Werner Heisenberg, and Agatha Christie. At the movies we watched Rocky and Network as well as A Star is Born and Taxi Driver. We listened to Natalie Cole, Paul Simon, Judy Collins, and Ray Charles. Remember Convoy, 50 Ways to Leave Your Lover, and Take it to the Limit? And the Muppet Show broadcast for the first time.

Western Washington was beginning to recover from the massive Boeing layoffs five years earlier, but unemployment issues and a sluggish economy still lingered. However, the Trans-Alaska Pipeline construction was drawing lots of workers north.

The Seattle Seahawks played their first game that August a month after the Summer Olympics were held in Montreal. The New York Yankees lost the World Series to Cincinnati Reds in October. And, of course, the Seattle Supersonics were building momentum for a championship in the near future. The Steelers won Super Bowl X over the Cowboys.

In four decades our daily lives have been transformed. The United States population has grown by more than 100 million to an estimated 323 million. The products we buy are manufactured in factories or grown in all parts the world. Personal computers

and mobile devices connect us to a world wide communications net 24/7. The amount of information we can access is mind boggling.

Automation made possible by computer technology is gradually reducing the number of human beings required to create goods and deliver services. Driverless automobiles are a scary possibility (perhaps less scary than vehicles driven by texting fiends or mobile phonies behind the wheel.)

Forty year of plusses and minuses. Better living through amazing developments facilitated by silicon. No more rotary dial phones. No more analog CRT TVs. No more typewriter ribbons. No more slide rules.

What is this world coming to?
