# **Upgrading?** Resources You Can Use

The newest system versions–iOS 11 and macOS 10.13 arrived in September and gave us all a chance to remember how wonderful/worrisome/frightening change can be! New features for the iDevice universe included some that offered iPad users some familiar functions from Macs. High Sierra on the Mac concentrated on under-the-hood changes while it does have a few new bells and whistles--especially notable will be the new file system for solid state storage users.

While we wait for the dust to settle, there was one feature of this year's update for OS X that we have not dealt with for awhile: software and hardware that are not compatible. Third party developers are working on upgrades for many of the applications but some will not be fixed (particularly older versions that have "newer" siblings on the market.) Some hardware is waiting for new drivers to be released.

Every time a system is updated or a new product is released, we wait for our favorite authors to release their manuals on how to use the new stuff. Even though the systems have been in public beta for a few months, it takes time for the final publications to make it to the book shelves of your favorite bookseller--at the Mall or online.

memory was measured in kilobytes and storage in megabytes in those early days. A local gaggle of text-basedBulletin Boards using dial-up modems was the bleeding edge; something called the World Wide Web had just been announced.

High school seniors today have been in the iPhone age since they were second graders. They have grown up using personal computers and mobile phones as tools. Some of us still regard these "tools" as awe-some technological wonders. Every time I open my old-hat flip phone I have a brief flashback to 1966 and Captain Kirk asking Scotty to beam him up.

I am still amazed at the power of the personal computer sitting on my desk or the iPad I hold in my hand. I'm an old guy: I remember when area codes and touch-tone phones were introduced. I remember when the only television station in the State of Washington was in Seattle. There was a time when you had to go to the library or find an encyclopedia or pick up a dictionary to find out stuff. Daily newspapers and weekly magazines informed us about the world beyond the horizon. Today we carry in our pockets a link to video of events as they are happening—live—half a world away.

Issues that were in another county, a different state, or some other part of the globe could be absorbed at a more leisurely rate when we learned of them hours or days after they happened. Somewhere along the way the transistor arrived, Telstar began orbiting the planet, and video tape machines provided instant replay. Seems like everyone wants to know everything about everybody these days and the want to know it now.

So here we are settling in for another November: ending daylight savings, voting by Election Day, remembering on Veteran's Day, gathering on Thanksgiving Day, and shopping on Black Friday. And here we are, as geeks, adapting to newly released versions of iOS and macOS to power the wonders we use to connect to the universe of technology. This time of year is typically when new systems and new hardware is introduced. The thrill of playing with the new stuff can be exhilarating or it may become a frustrating journey into cyberhell.

November nostalgia for me also recalls the celebrations when friends arrived from far away (60 miles

was a big deal in those days!) to share a day with our family as we sat down to a Thanksgiving feast. As a kid, it was a treat to listen to my parent's friends catch up on all the news, consider some of the trends of culture, and share their civil opinion about politics. From this distance the concerns they shared seem rather tame and somewhat familiar. Government was doing too little or too much. There were some very bad actors on the World Stage that did not like us. The cost of living was out of control. The younger generation was not getting the education or motivation they should. But we were thankful that we could gather for another year and celebrate our history and toast our future.

Reasons to celebrate Thanksgiving that were true six or seven decades ago are still valid today. Family and friends define our history and our future. We gather again to share, to reflect, to resolve, to restore, to reaffirm, to persevere...
