force who took up the new tools and tasks without batting an eye.

So, there was this group of folks who needed to investigate, discover, explore, and master some new stuff. They did what people in those days did—they formed a club to master their Apple IIs and Macs. That is how and why NorthWest Apple Pickers was invented.

In 1984 there was an evolutionary revolution taking hold. Personal computers were not a common, everyday appliance as they are three and half decades later. Space Age digital tech was just beginning to touch lives of us ordinary citizens.

Desktop, stand-alone computers in the era had made their way into the offices of many companies, schools, and homes. There were dozens of brands. There were lots of different takes on user-interfaces and a grand supply of games and clever applications that junior high schoolers were inventing. Then there were the serious applications that inspired corporations and enterprises to purchase computers and place them on desks and counters for employees to master.

Among the brands vying for attention was Apple's Macintosh, which featured a What-You-See-Is-What-You-Get interface (WYSIWYG) that used a "mouse" to point to and click on menu choices. Microsoft had written a word processing application for Apple and other sophisticated software was joining the mix. Adobe and its predecessor had put incredible tools in the hands of ordinary folks. The printing industry was braced for a huge change. And that was not the only industry about to change.

Progressive companies and schools were buying the devices and drinking the kool aid. Who needed a stinkin' main frame computer when a handful of desktop units run by office staff could produce most of the same results? So our beloved group was formed. At first there were many more Apple II users. Those devices had been at the forefront of the personal computer market for several years when NWAP was created. The new Macintosh was an expensive alternative. For folks who had just become comfortable with command-line interface, the WYSIWYG was considered way too easy and simple: let the newbies who couldn't handle anything complicated use the Mac.

During the next few years more and more members were Mac fans and eventually the Apple II folks created a separate group to concentrate on their favorite platform.

Over the past couple of decades our membership has slowly reduced. The young whippersnappers these days began playing with "smart" devices before they could talk. The gee-whiz computers that amazed us have become a mere appliance for many folks these days.

But we persevere.

We are still interested in investigating, discovering, exploring, and mastering these devilishly clever little clumps of technology. From more than 20 pound lumps in those days to less than 8 ounces now—and we carry more power in our hand held iDevices than ever dreamed of in those early desktop models.

And so we begin our 35th year. Thank you to NWAP members, past and present. Our organization thrives because of the service our board of directors give. We're still a group of curious, motivated folks trying to figure out how to use these tools.
