Charles became Prince of Wales.

The Beatles gave their last public performance.

Daytime TV starts broadcasting in color beginning in September.

And a disastrous oil spill at Santa Barbara began a process that established Earth Day a year later.

By the end of the year NASA's Apollo missions had put 4 men on the Moon and Mariner 7 made a flyby mission to Mars. The technology developed for the Moon mission led to the chips that made possible the personal computer, cell phones, and a bunch of other technology we live with today. It was the summer when Unix was invented and ARPANET made the first interstate connection that led to the Internet. And Xerox invented the laser printer. (The typewriter's fate was sealed.)

It was in 1969 that the Boeing 747 and the Concorde SST both made their first flights. You can see that first 747 and one of the production Concordes at the Museum of Flight in Seattle.

That summer marked an amazing event in upstate New York at Woodstock, where about 400,000 people showed up for a muddy musical weekend. No riots, just a peaceful, gathering that surprised everyone. Elsewhere, our nation was dealing with an increasing division of opinion about the Viet Nam war with demonstration and counter-demonstrations. Simmering racial tensions became violent on several occasions a reminder of how civil rights issues unresolved then continue to challenge human beings to this day.

Hurricane Camille, the second most intense storm to make landfall in the United States, hits the Gulf Coast in August.

So many events from half a century ago cast a long shadow. There was all the usual daily "noise" going on then, as now, which tends to mask some of the developments which will create social, political, legal, and environmental waves that cascade down the decades.

The world in which we live today may, in half a century, be regarded as a watershed year—a time that recorded major world-changing events echoing far into the future. Something may have already happened this year that will prove that humanity gathered its wits and grinned at obstacles to perform remarkable achievements.

Perhaps such an event is just about to happen. Stay alert. Prepare to help make it happen. Let's send a **good** message to those folks in 2069 that we held up our part of the bargain. Do you think they'll be reading about it on Facebook or Twitter?

Do you suppose they'll still be eating scones and riding the Roller Coaster at The Fair?

#### **New Stuff is Almost Here**

September is the month when Apple usually announces new iPhone models, sometimes updates iPads or other hardware, and releases the latest versions of the Operating Systems that developers have been working on since the June World Wide Developers conference.

Some of us remember the excitement 21 years ago when we first touched the iMac at an Apple preview held at the Museum of Science & Industry in Seattle. Members of area user groups and other invitees were seeing the Real Deal weeks after Steve Jobs keynote introduction and a few weeks before the new machine would reach our local stores. Of course, in 1998 there were not many stores selling Apple computers, and some of the ones that were, shouldn't have been.

The iMac changed all that. For all the retail ups and downs before and since, its release marked a change in Apple's ability to capture consumer interest. In the two decades since, Apple has shown a similar ability to take an existing product transform it. From the iPod to the iPhone or the Watch, the company has moved far beyond the Macintosh computer realm of the 20th Century.

This Fall we are expecting releases of the next mac-OS 10.15 (Catalina), iOS 13, as well as updates for tvOS, watchOS, and a revised array of services and software support.



Are you ready? Your "old" 32 bit software may need to be updated to 64 bit. (Check your software in the About this Mac>System Report...>Software/Applications.) Your libraries for photos, music, TV or movies may be reorganized by software revisions to iTunes and Photos. Your favorite way to organize files may be subject to new "improved" defaults when the new systems install.

Word to the wise: Back up. Back up. Back up. Be patient. Don't panic. Back up.
