the benefit of booze, since Prohibition began in January.) Perhaps not quite so turbulent, the 1820 campaign posed no candidate to oppose the reelection of James Madison and his VP, Daniel D. Tompkins.

An issue that will not go away (nor will it be resolved) is climate change. No matter what is causing it, the trend is clearly not comforting. There are just a whole lot of people on the planet scurrying after shrinking resources. We have managed to increase agricultural production in the last century. Will we be able to continue to pace to expand to meet demand? Are other needs going to go unanswered? Can we find the ways to harness science and technology quickly enough to keep our heads above water?

For those of us who have been around the block a few times, contrasting some of the "good" old times with present days is a nostalgic exercise that offers a smile or two. Current generations are unlikely to find our reminiscences as entertaining or instructive as we do. The price of gas in 1950 or cost of a new house in 1975 may look like a bargain...when you figure inflation into the mix mostly it turns out that today's prices are not dramatically out of line. \$1,900 would pay for a new Volkswagen in 1960, with change. Today's entry level VW requires about \$20,000. Of course, the media wage in 1960 was about \$5,000 and today is reported be in the vicinity of \$60,000 and going north.

By the end of 2020 we undoubtedly will find fewer swaths of land in our area that are cultivated for crops or manage forest areas. Commercial development and production of houses, apartments, warehouses, and office space has changed our landscape/cityscape. The number of folks who share our space has grown phenomenally. There are six times as many humans sharing our county now as there were when President Harding was running for election in 1920.

Here we are looking at where we have come from and trying to guess where we are going to wind up. Technology is going to push the envelope just as it has transformed the worldwide culture over the past two decades. Personal computers, smartphones, and Internet connectivity are items we can touch. They represent the tip of the iceberg in the way science and industry are using them and the tools they make possible to change our economies, health care, communications, education, safety, and security. — and at the same time enabling the destructive use of these same forces to do no good.

Could you have forecast the current state of our planet at the beginning of 2010? Our Macs were running 10.6 Snow Leopard and iPhones were using iOS 3. The iPod had been around for 9 years as had Google Earth. The first iPad was just about to be announced. Did you predict the Internet of Things or plan for e-tail commerce? Did anyone expect the massive security breaches that plagued our personal accounts and our National elections in this decade?

My head aches when I try to think ahead to what questions we'll be asking in 12 months. I cannot begin to imagine how many things we be forever changed by then.

High hopes, indeed. Peace. Civility. Positivity. Who is writing the code for these and designing the chips that will deliver them? Fasten your seatbelts!
